III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

• Byrnes Guillaume motioned to approve previous minutes. Connie Jenkins-Pye seconded the motion. **MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY**

 President Moore was unable to locate minutes from the Spring meeting; deferred to Secretary Hill—she was not the secretary at that time and volunteered to contact the previous Secretary.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- President's Report (Ahli Moore)
 - o Doak Campbell Stadium Statue -
 - President Moore met with the Athletic Director. The Athletic Department desires to honor the contributions of Black Athletes at FSU with a statue similar to those that currently surround the stadium
 - Anticipated Cost of the Statue: \$100,000
 - FSUBA is not responsible for funding the initiative but rather serves as consultants with former Black Athletes and Alumni to discuss further logistics.
 - o Black Alumni Collective Duke 2022
 - Name changed to reflect that they are a collective of Black Alumni from PWIs
 - An invitation extended to attend the annual conference
 - Virtual Conference: Saturday, March 12, 2022
 - In-person: Thursday, April 28 Sunday, May 1, 2022, in Durham, NC on the campus of Duke University
 - Kyle Hires, FSUBA Atlanta Regional Representative, is a part of the committee
 - Registration is required
 - FSUBA previously offered a stipend to subsidize registration costs in 2019.

- Will look to provide something similar for interested attendees.
- If interested in attending please let President Moore know.
- Student Union Room Naming
 - Nine (9) board members toured the construction site.
 - Completion target Spring 2022
 - Cost of naming rights \$10,000
 - Agreement reached in Spring 2021 to pay
 - **QUESTION**: Is there a current fundraising campaign to pay for this?
 - **RESPONSE**: Yes, the FSUBA is always accepting monetary donations for operational initiatives like this.
- o D9 Garden (Alanna Kibiloski)
 - End of Union adjacent to Moore Auditorium
 - Brick Base
 - Informational Panel including organizations shield, FSU chapter history, and national history
 - Will represent all D9 organizations
 - Currently, seven (7) of nine (9) organizations are active on FSU's campus/
 - Anticipated cost \$300,000 350,000
 - Start of a campus initiative to share costs
- o Embracing FSU Panama City Alumni
 - Spoke with the Dean of Students. The purpose is to make graduates of the Panama City Campus feel more connected to Main Campus.
 - Appointed FSU Panama City Regional Representative
- o FSU Alumni Association Board applications (Julie Decker)
 - CEO/President Decker shared the timeline for the FSU Alumni Board of Directors Application process:
 - **NOVEMBER/DECEMBER**: Applications open on November 12 until the end of December 2022.
 - o Candidates will submit applications with resumes
 - JANUARY/FEBRUARY: Subcommittee reviews candidate applications
 - MARCH: Candidate Interviews
 - APRIL/MAY: Candidate names go before the current board
 - JUNE/JULY: Candidates are notified of the decision.
 - In this election cycle, there is a very limited number of vacant positions (4).
 - Representation matters:
 - The average age of all alumni is e 45
 - 40 total board member spots
 - 57% men 43% women
 - 8 Networks
 - The goal is to find service opportunities for all applicants.

 - Strategic Plan
 - The overall vision, the strategic plan needs to be revised.
 - We're not starting from scratch rather building on the foundation.

 - o MyVillage Project
 - A Black-led organization out of Jacksonville, FL.
 - They specialize in funding service projects through education.
 - 50 organizations including FSUBA involved
 - Received \$2000 stipend to FSUBA to assist in the community
 - o Ribault Middle School
 - o Sankofa Emeritus Recognition
 - There was a discussion in August 2021 about celebrating and honoring those Alumni that graduated 40+ years ago.
 - Major Upcoming Milestones
 - 2022 60th anniversary of FSU Integration
 - 2023 40th anniversary for FSUBA
 - We want to recognize graduates/enrollees that fall within the gap of the current Emeritus Society and these milestone years.

 - Provost Retiring → The replacement will be an internal one and will be named by January 2022
 - The Board of Trustees has a committee to advance the University forward towards a \$1B endowment
 - Alumni, Alumni Clubs, Boosters all play a role in this with better and more purposeful reporting of who is attending functions and meetings.

 - 12,000 Members strong

 - FALL 2022: The Scholarship committee coordinates with the Office of Financial Aid to ensure that students receive their scholarship award in August.
